Iowa Employment Facts

Iowa's unemployment rate is currently 2.9%.²

Manufacturing is the largest industry by employment. These jobs can include; machine operator, assembler, auditors, welders, engineers, painters, and carpenters.²

A Registered Apprenticeship Program offers on- the job internships where you learn while earning a paycheck from day one. Apprentice training can include; plumbing, cosmetology, HVAC, sheet metal workers and more.

Welders who completed the Registered Apprenticeship Program were earning a **median annual income of \$91,304** four years after completion.²

Many high demand jobs in Iowa are eligible for scholarships and grants.¹ High demand jobs include, but are not limited to; truck drivers, registered nurses, software programmers, bus drivers, dental assistants, medical assistants and cooks.
