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Iowa Total Care Prevents Gap in Care



An Iowa Total Care member was about to "age out" of Medicaid-covered Home Health Nursing. This member required 24-hour assistance and two people for personal care needs.

The member was on several waiting lists for new home-based care. But the waiting list was long, and any gap in services wouldn't work for the primary caregiver: the member's mother.

Iowa Total Care took steps to prevent a gap in care by reaching out to the state to gain approval to extend nursing care. It worked, and the care was extended for one extra year or until new care was available.

With 16 hours of nursing services each day, 7 days a week, this member can remain at home.

Value-Added Services

Pregnant members can receive a car seat or booster seat for their babies. To be eligible, members must:

Free car seat or booster seat

- Have a completed notification of pregnancy form on file.
- Visit their doctor while in the first trimester or within 42 days of enrollment in Iowa Medicaid, and
- · Be engaged with Start Smart for Your Baby until 36 weeks of pregnancy.



Home-Delivered Meals

Pregnant or have a new baby? Struggling to feed your family or yourself? You may qualify for free home-delivered meals. We'll take the worry out of mealtime, so you can focus on your new little one.

Iowa Total Care staff will also discuss your future food needs. There may be a program that can help. If eligible, we'll help you apply.

Foster Care Kits

We know being a teen can be tough, especially if you're in foster care. That's why Iowa Total Care offers a free focus kit to these members. Wondering what might be inside?

- Items to help you relax and have fun, like stress balls and games.
- · Cool tools for learning and creating, like books and notebooks.
- Helpful reading on managing anxiety and starting high school.

Education Benefits

Missing a high school diploma? Earn your HiSET certificate, and earn My Health Pays rewards, too! HiSET is a high school equivalency test. It shows that you have the same knowledge and skills as a high school graduate. You'll get a certificate when you pass. It's called a high school equivalency diploma (HSED). Having a HSED can help you achieve your career and school goals.

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What is Health Literacy?

Can you think about a time when you:

- Needed to find a specialist or decide on a treatment plan?
- Received instructions for taking medicine?
- Were asked questions about your personal health history
- Searched for a health topic online?

You probably said yes to one or more of these questions.

Nearly 9 out of 10 adults struggle to understand and use personal health information. Learning how to understand this information is called health literacy.

Improving health literacy helps you:

- · Use health information to make the best decisions for yourself.
- Follow and manage your medications.
- · Understand and decide which providers, services, and treatments best fit your needs.
- Manage chronic medical conditions.

How to improve your health literacy

You can take the following steps to improve your health literacy.

- 1. Have a plan for every provider visit.
- 2. Ask your provider to explain something you don't understand.
- 3. Repeat back what you heard.
- 4. Ask for handouts, photos, or videos.
- 5. Bring a friend or family member to your visit.
- 6. Look for multilingual providers if needed and ask for translation.
